



During discussion, genuine concern was expressed by all parishes present over the lack of basic infrastructure which would be essential to support the proposed number of dwellings, viz: sewage facilities, utilities, road connectivity, GP surgery etc. There would be significant additional pressure on both the A1 and A47, as well as on ancillary roads and bridges.

It was important that parish councils raise their concerns to influence the proposed Local Plans. A collective voice would be effective to impart the impact on local villages. The reinstatement of ParishWatch may be necessary, with a further meetings arranged as soon as possible.
